








# **UNITED NATIONS DAY**















## **ROSARY MONTH**

During these sessions, the children were guided to pray the rosary in a simple and engaging manner, suitable for their young age. Teachers and staff explained the meaning of the prayers and the importance of devoting time to connect with God. The children gathered in a calm and prayerful environment, holding rosary beads as they recited the prayers together.
