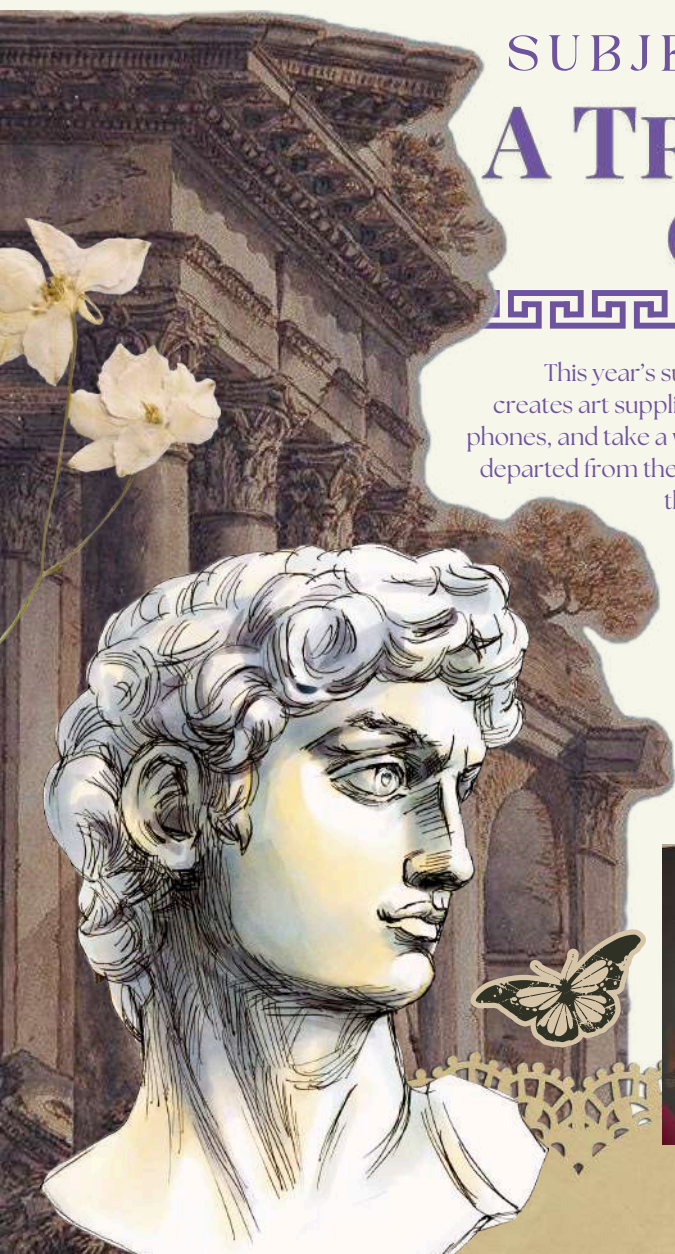
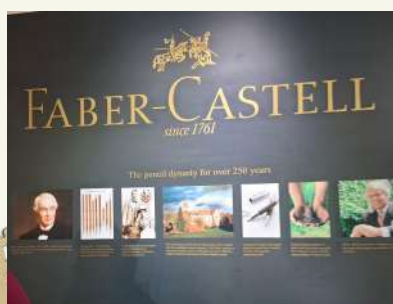


SUBJECT TRIP GRADE 8: A TRIP TO THE WORLD OF CREATIVITY

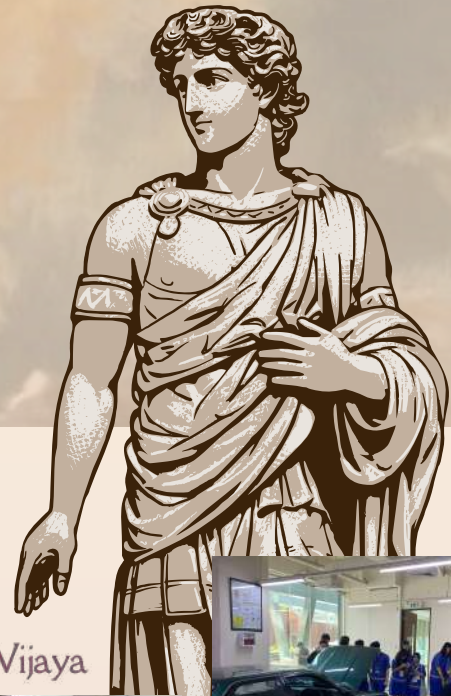
GRADE 9 SUBJECT TRIP

Sustainability

Differing from the previous year, for the new academic year Saint John's School Gading Serpong replaced its usual mid-semester exams with integrated projects. Sustainability was the main theme for this first quarter as students had to integrate all their school subjects with this theme into their final products.

Sustainability is the ability to support or maintain a process over time. Although each grade had different outputs, everyone had the same objective. The integrated projects started on September 11, 2024 until September 24, 2024, this period was for both creating the projects and presenting them.

All the students were divided into several groups within their classes to balance everyone's strengths and weaknesses, which was to maximize each member's full potential. This develops efficient teamwork and provides desirable outcomes. The seventh graders created a piggy bank out of recycled materials to exercise their creativity along with applying the 3 R's.

A commercial was created by the eighth graders as they promote the importance of sustainability. The ninth graders worked together to create an e-magazine about sustainability with the use of html. In tenth grade they promoted sustainability through a campaign video. The eleventh graders integrated all their school subjects and sustainability into a magazine as their final output. The twelfth graders designed clothes with the use of recycled materials. Each of these outputs have two things in common, that is they are integrated with all their subjects and sustainability.



Once finished with their outputs, each student had to make an individual report which highlights their experience and the things they have learnt from each subject. For junior high-school they had to make a 2,500 word report while the senior high-schoolers made a 3,000 word report. Finally, each team had to present their final outputs to the panel of three teachers. Scheduled times were set for each group to present. The integrated projects were a unique and educational way to assess the students within the last quarter. Much more interesting compared to a written sit-down exam.

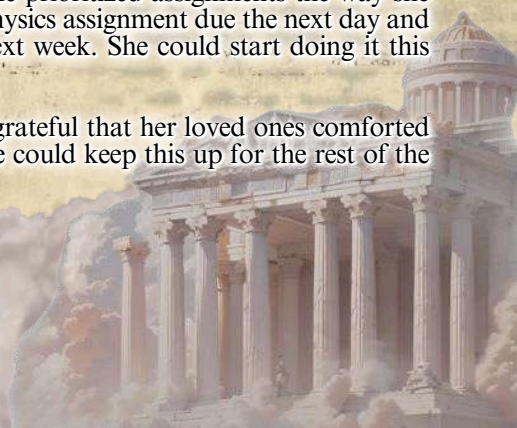
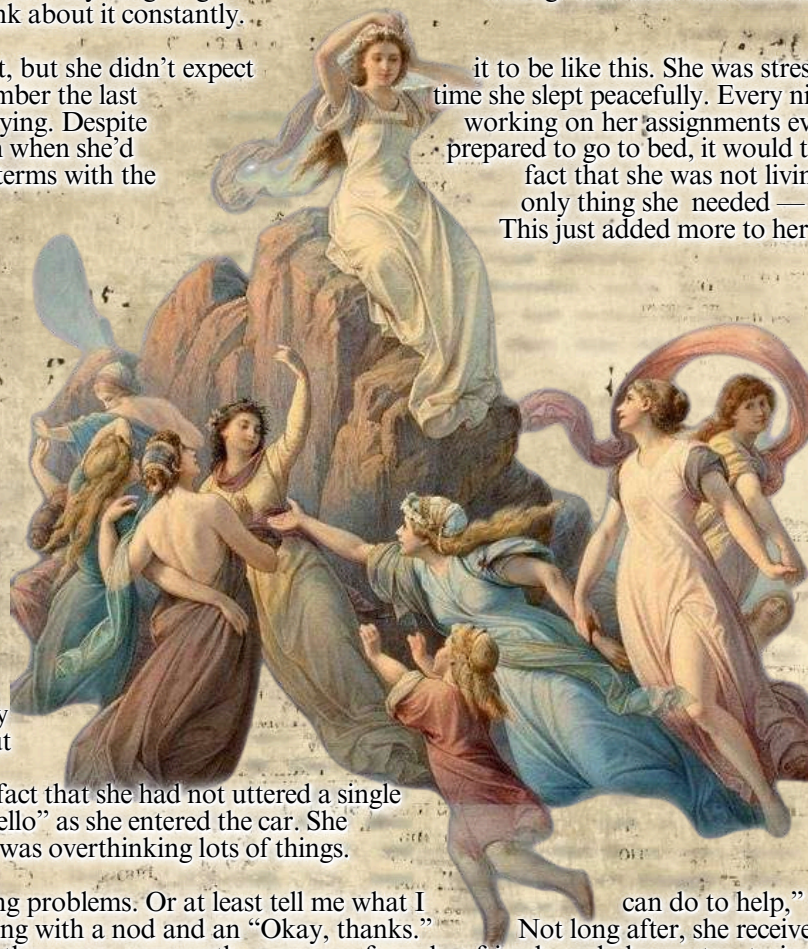

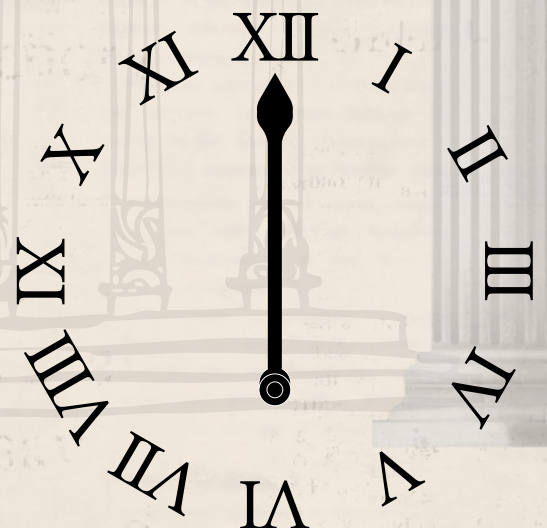
